Codes of Practice - Programming Policy

2CHR Programming is co-ordinated by a committee-appointed Programming Officer. All members of the community and community organisations are invited and encouraged to engage in our programming via commentary, requests and in-show involvement. All are invited to become members and train as presenters.

The program content aims to appeal to the broader community while keeping adequate space for specialty tastes and needs. This includes care organisations, indigenous groups, local artists, sporting organisations, religious organisations and government representatives.

Program proposals are requested from all current presenters as well as other volunteers.

Survey forms included in the station newsletter "AIRTIME" and on the 2CHR Webpage (WWW.2CHR.ORG) ask for ideas regarding program content desired by respondents. There is also a Facebook page that provides direct community interaction.

Messages are broadcast year around seeking feedback from listeners, whether members or not, as well as inviting listeners to attend open Committee meetings. These open meetings are held three times per year including the Annual General Meeting.

An invitation to those attending to participate in assisting with program development and production is constantly extended.

During visits to service clubs or groups by station personnel opportunities are afforded to seek ideas or comments regarding programs.

Many groups accept invitations to visit the Radio Station to see how programs are presented and have less formal conversations with station presenters and volunteers regarding program content.

Community Profile programs are aired every morning from 9 a.m. until noon and can regularly have up to five guests in a program, many of whom contribute ideas regarding what they regard as desirable content.

Presenters are encouraged to seek phone calls from listeners and requests for musical choices and comments regarding program content. This information can be used when program proposals are being prepared.
